# **Convent Primary School – Annual Report 2018/2019**

The Convent Primary School had a population 115 at the end of the school year 2018/2019. We have 5 class teachers, 1 full time Special Education Teachers (SET), 1 part time SET (17.25 hours), 1 SNA, 1 secretary (15 hours) and 1 Caretaker (20 hours). The Secretary works Tuesday (9:00am-1:30pm), Wednesday (9:00-3:00pm) and Thursday (9:00-1:30pm).

The Convent Primary School is a Roman Catholic School under the Patronage of the Diocese of Killaloe. The Board ensures that the religious ethos and characteristic spirit is being promoted and developed.

At the Convent Primary School, we aspire to help each child reach her full potential in a Christian atmosphere where respect, responsibility and cooperation are central to all learning experiences. We aim:

The Board ratified a new Safeguarding Statement in line with new DES requirements. A child protection risk assessment of activities in the school was carried out. The Safeguarding Statement is communicated to the whole school community via the school's website. The Statement is also on display inside Min entrance to the school. Child Protection is on the agenda at every BOM as per guidelines. A child protection oversight report is delivered at

each Board of Management meeting Children with over 20 days missed included in reports issued to TÚSLA as per guidelines at the end of the school year.

## **Purpose of the Annual Report**

The purpose of this Annual Report is to provide a summary of information on the operation of the Convent Primary School, in line with the requirements of the Education Act. This report serves as an addition to the information provided on the school website www.cpskillaloe.ie , the various newsletters issued by the school, the information booklet issued to all new parents in June of each year and information provided to parents on all other occasions.

#### **Finances**

The Board have submitted its accounts to the school accountant for certification. School finances require prudent financial management. Additional funds are provided by school fundraising activities. The Board would like to sincerely thank all those who support these activities so generously and assure them that the money will be used prudently. The Board would like to acknowledge the wonderful work done by the treasurer of the board, Joan Needham. A total of 27,506.16 was raised over the last 4 years. Sincere thanks to the parents, Parents Association and staff for all the work they have put into achieving this substantial amount.

## **Policy Development**

#### Standardised Testing:

Academic Attainment Standardised testing took place in May for English Reading (Micra-T) and Mathematics (Sigma-T). Results were analysed and comparisons were made to the national norms. Our overall school wide test results in the Micra T and the Sigma T reflect very well the national norms and we have pinpointed our areas for growth next year. In general terms they would include: • Development of problem solving in Mathematics • Focus on strategies and interventions to support struggling readers – strategies to improve mental maths.

## **In-School Management**

The in-school management team changed during the academic year as staff members were on approved leave. Posts of responsibilities are due to be reviewed in September 2019.
